Synopsis

Bass Lake is connected to Kahshe Lake by a navigable channel at Houseys Rapids. The fish communities of the lakes are similar and there is some movement of fish between the two lakes. The Kahshe Lake fact sheet should be consulted for more information.

The 2009 netting survey found that walleye, pike and probably crappie move seasonally into Bass Lake and its tributaries to spawn and to take advantage of the slightly warmer spring water temperature. It is doubtful that large numbers of either species, except for possibly crappie, would stay in Bass Lake through the summer months. Walleye tagged in Bass Lake in the spring were caught throughout Kahshe Lake the following summer. A former walleye spawning site (once a spring sanctuary) on the Gartersnake River, one of the two main tributaries has fallen into disuse due to several blockages between the spawning site and the lake. Despite this, the walleye population in Kahshe Lake seems to be sustaining itself, if not improving in recent years.

Two brook trout were caught in the 1975 survey. It is thought that they originated from the tributary streams. The water quality and resident fish community of the lake are hostile to trout and their occurrence is considered accidental.

Grass Pickerel have been documented in Bass Lake. The species is a small member of the pike family, generally growing to only about 20 cm long. Populations occur elsewhere in the lower Severn River basin as well.
